

Hardwaste verge collection starting soon

The Shire of Katanning is providing one hard waste collection for residential properties that currently receive a rubbish (or bin) service. This is all residential properties within the town site. As verge collection are picked up by mechanical means, please follow the advised information below to avoid any concerns:

What will be collected:

Old furniture

White goods (fridges, stoves etc)

Scrap metal Timber Products (up to 2m in length)

General junk

Up to 3 cubic metres of material (ie 1x1x3 metres)

What will NOT be collected:

NO green waste

NO asbestos or fibre cement products

NO foodstuff or domestic rubbish

NO bricks, sand or building rubble

NO tyres, batteries or oil

NO car bodies or vehicle parts

NO liquid waste

NO household hazardous, medical or veterinary waste

NO cement or concrete

NO stumps, palm logs or tree roots

NO paints, chemicals, oils or acids

NO object exceeding 2m in length


Place your bulk rubbish on the verge without obstructing footpaths into two separate piles

Pile 1: White goods only

Pile 2: General goods only

To prevent the risk of child entrapment, doors MUST be detached from fridges & freezers. The truck collecting metal products is a separate truck from the general collection vehicle.

Winter Warming Warnings

As the seasons change and we start looking to warm up our homes don't forget to do a few simple safety steps before to help keep your home and your family safe.

- 1. Smoke Alarms Make sure they are working and have a new battery installed. It's all very well to have one in your house but they need to be tested regularly to make sure they will work when needed. They can be the difference between life and death by giving you and your loved ones the early warning you need should the worst happen and your house catches fire.
- 2. Clean your chimneys Before lighting the first fire for the year clean your chimney and fire place or get someone to do it for you. Every year fire brigades are called out to chimney fires across the state. If the home owner is lucky the fire can be contained to the chimney. If not, the fire can quickly spread and engulf an entire house.

By spending the time now, you can help safe guard your family from the horrific reality of a house fire.





Each application will be assessed against the following criteria:

- a. Does the project meet a community need?
- b. Does the project benefit a sufficiently broad, or diverse, target group?
- c. Does the organisation have the capacity to undertake and manage the project?
- d. Does the application represent value for money?
- e. collaborative community wide projects are encouraged;

f. demonstrating alignment with the Shire of Katanning community vision

To submit an application for CFAP funding, applicants must complete an application form located on the Shire of Katanning website at www.katanning.wa.gov.au or at the Shire of Katanning administration building.

Council Meeting Highlights

April 2018

The following items were approved at the Council meeting:

1. Corporate Business Plan

Council adopted the Shire of Katanning Corporate Business Plan 2017 – 2021.

2. Lake Ewlyamartup

Council granted permission to Wheatbelt Natural Resource Management to temporarily block the Ewlyamartup Creek to assist with the construction of engineering designs as part of the Living Lakes Project – Stage 3, due for project completion in June 2019.

3. Katanning Heritage Centre Project

Council endorsed the following projects to be included in the Town Centre Priority List of projects as part of the Katanning Heritage Centre Project:

- 1. Austral Terrace footpath and Dome corner.
- 2. Signage and arrival points.
- 3. Trees and planting.
- 4. Austral Terrace parking areas from Clive Street roundabout to and including the Railway Station.
- 5. Tourism Strategy to service tourism.
- 6. Aberdeen Street RV overnight parking and RV dump point.
- 7. Roundabout Improve RV negotiability.
- 8. Paving strategy and street furniture.
- 9. Austral Terrace carpark south of the Railway Station.
- Improve landscapes to the four parks and links at the Clive Street/ Austral Terrace/ Railway node.
- 11. Katanning stories Heritage trails.
- 12. Taylor Street pedestrian and lighting upgrade.
